## The Son of God Betrayed, Arrested, Forsaken

- **John 13:27, 30-31** <sup>27</sup>Now after the piece of bread, Satan entered him. Then Jesus said to him, "What you do, do quickly." ... <sup>30</sup>Having received the piece of bread, he then went out immediately. And it was night. <sup>31</sup>So, when he had gone out, Jesus said, "Now the Son of Man is glorified, and God is glorified in Him."
- **John 18:1-3** When Jesus had spoken these words, He went out with His disciples over the Brook Kidron, where there was a garden, which He and His disciples entered. <sup>2</sup>And Judas, who betrayed Him, also knew the place; for Jesus often met there with His disciples. <sup>3</sup>Then Judas, having received a detachment of *troops*, and officers from the chief priests and Pharisees, came there with lanterns, torches, and weapons.
- **John 18:4** Jesus therefore, knowing all things that would come upon Him, went forward and said to them, "Whom are you seeking?"
- John 18:5a They answered Him, "Jesus of Nazareth."
- **John 18:5b** Jesus said to them, "I am *He*." And Judas, who betrayed Him, also stood with them.
- Exodus 3:14 "'I AM has sent me [Moses] to you. [Israelites]' "
- **Exodus 6:3** "I appeared to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, as God Almighty [YHWH, *traditionally Jehovah*], but by my name LORD I was not known to them."
- **John 8:58** Jesus said to them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I AM.
- **John 18:6** Now when He said to them, "I am *He*," they drew back and fell to the ground.
- **John 18:7-9** <sup>7</sup>Then He asked them again, "Whom are you seeking?" And they said, "Jesus of Nazareth." <sup>8</sup>Jesus answered, "I have told you that I am *He*. Therefore, if you seek Me, let these go their way," <sup>9</sup>that the saying might be fulfilled which He spoke, "Of those whom You gave Me I have lost none."
- **John 6:39** "This is the will of the Father who sent Me, that of all He has given Me I should lose nothing, but should raise it up at the last day."
- **John 17:12** "While I was with them in the world, <u>I kept them in Your name</u>. Those whom You gave Me I have kept, and <u>none of them is lost except</u> the son of perdition, that the Scripture might be fulfilled."
- **John 18:10** Then Simon Peter, having a sword, drew it and struck the high priest's servant, and cut off his right ear, The servant's name was Malchus.
  - "What a foolish thing to do, flashing about without any commandment from the Lord! After all, just injuring a poor servant who was not responsible for what went on. Somebody has said, 'How often we are like Peter. How busy we keep the Lord putting on ears that we cut off.' We do not mean to do it, perhaps, but we go around saying such unkind foolish things that we injure people instead of

helping them. I am sure that Peter would have had great difficulty in leading Malchus to Christ after cutting off his ear! Don't cut people's ears off and then expect them to hear your message. Peter forgot that grace and truth came by Jesus Christ."

- **Luke 22:51** But Jesus answered and said, "Permit even this." And He touched his ear and healed him.
- **Luke 23:28** "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for Me, but weep for yourselves and for your children."
- **Luke 23:34a** Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do."
- **John 18:11** So Jesus said to Peter, "Put your sword into the sheath. Shall I <u>not drink the cup</u> which My Father has given Me?"
- **Psalm 11:6** Upon the wicked He will rain coals; fire and brimstone and a burning wind *shall be* the portion of their <u>cup</u>.
- **Psalm 75:8 KJV** For in the hand of the LORD *there is* a <u>cup</u>, and the wine is red; it is full of mixture; and He poureth out the same; but the <u>dregs</u> thereof, all the wicked of the earth shall wring them out, *and* drink them.
- **John 18:12-14** <sup>12</sup>Then the detachment of *troops* and the captain and the officers of the Jews arrested Jesus and bound Him. <sup>13</sup>And they led Him away to Annas first, for he was the father-in-law of Cāiaphas who was high priest that year. <sup>14</sup>Now it was Cāiaphas who advised the Jews that it was expedient that one man should die for the people.
- **John 11:49-51** <sup>49</sup>And one of them, Cāiaphas, being high priest that year, said to them, "You know nothing at all, <sup>50</sup>nor do you consider that it is expedient for us that one man should die for the people, and not that the whole nation should perish." <sup>51</sup>Now this he did not say on his own *authority*; but being high priest that year he prophesied that Jesus would die for the nation.
- **John 18:15** And Simon Peter followed Jesus, and so did <u>another disciple</u>. Now <u>that disciple</u> was <u>known to the high priest</u>, and went with Jesus into the courtyard of the high priest.
- **John 18:16-17** <sup>16</sup>But Peter stood at the door outside. Then the <u>other disciple</u>, which was known to the high priest, went out and spoke to her who kept the door, and brought Peter in. <sup>17</sup>Then the servant girl who kept the door said to Peter, "You are not <u>also</u> *one* of this Man's disciples are you?" He said, "I am not."
- **John 18:18** Now the servants and officers who had made a fire of coals stood there, for it was cold, and they warmed themselves. And Peter stood with them and warmed himself.
